Acoustic Guitar for Beginners

We have learnt several chords now and use them to play along to backing tracks of well-known but simple songs. After a short break for a coffee and a natter we then move Into the second part where we play along to songs using the techniques taught in the first half as well as what we've been practicing at home. The aim is to make this as much fun an experience for everyone as possible and hopefully at the end of each meeting people go away having enjoyed it as well as having learnt something new about this wonderful instrument called the guitar.

Nature and Bird Watching

Though primarily we are a bird watching group we do in reality take an interest in all wildlife we come across, from mammals, insects and butterflies to plants and fungi. You do not need to be an expert, all are welcome and if you enjoy photography do bring your camera. In October, eleven of us visited Old Town Cove. It stayed dry and we managed just under 40 species of birds, only 3 varieties of butterflies and to our delight a grey seal. Some of the notable finds were the Osprey, Kingfisher, plenty of waders such as Godwit, Red and Greenshank, 500+Oyster Catchers and Dunlin.

Photography

We are a friendly photography group with a wide variety of skill levels and interests. The group meets three times each month. One of our meetings sees us out around Cornwall and sometimes further afield, taking pictures and helping each other to try new photographic techniques and challenges. There are also two meetings held online - in one we share and discuss images based on a monthly theme, whilst in the second we explore a variety of topics related to camera techniques in a little more depth. Over the last ten years we have also held four successful exhibitions . We welcome members with all ranges of ability and equipment - most of us started using our phone as a camera! There is an annual fee of £10 to join this group to fund the Zoom licence which is used for our online meetings and allows us to post recordings of the meetings on our webpage. Our first field trip for 2025 is planned for Charlestown.

All-in-all the play was engrossing, funny and a little bit creepy. All of the theatre group went home feeling that the play was £10 very well spent and all are looking forward to his next play. We also saw **Pepper and Honey**, a one woman play performed by the Not Now Collective which was a poignant, subtle and timely play about the journey of change. cultural differences and trying not to feel a foreigner in your adopted country. The walk finished with some of the party descending on the Community Centre Café for sustenance.

Wine Appreciation

In October we met at Christine's house and enjoyed a range of wines from Sainsbury's. The choices were made based on the unusual bottles. The choice ranged from an AI selected white blend through to a solid red in a dumpy bottle. The prices did seem high but one of the best was the Spanish Albarino white in the blue bottle at £16. In November we met at the Community Centre and enjoyed a range of wines personally imported by Sue and Carl. The choices were made were from their recent trip to France. The prices paid in France for this quality wine were very reasonable, all being at the 10 euro mark. The wines were all very good, the group liked the Brouilly (a cru Beaujolais) best closely followed by the Saint Véran an elegant white. The Coteaux de L'Aubance turned out to be a sweet wine, not in favour with the group, and the Haut Medoc Bordeaux was nice but might have needed another year to mellow.

Our 2025 schedule is now on the website and we will continue with a regular fixture of 3pm on the last Monday of the month. The location will be either in a members home or the Cafe of the Community centre. We plan to go to other locations for visits to tastings and vineyards, to be advised.
