

### FEBRUARY/MARCH 2025 NEWSLETTER

Welcome to the February/March edition of the Lostwithiel Area u3a Newsletter. In this issue there's news of our Art Appreciation group getting a mention on the BBC, the Family History group looking at the use of Tithe Maps and AI (Artificial Intelligence) in genealogy and the Strummers Ukulele Group performing two Christmas concerts at Lanhydock.

#### JANUARY OPEN MEETING

Our first – very well attended - Open Meeting of 2025 was on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> January in the Church Rooms in Lostwithiel where the guest speaker was **Lynn Goold**, who took us on a guided tour through **Daphne du Maurier's Cornwall**. Lynn gave us some fascinating insights into du Maurier's life in Cornwall and how the landscape, people and places influenced her novels such as *Frenchman's Creek, My Cousin Rachel, Rebecca* and *Jamaica Inn*. Lynn also gave us some background into the du Maurier Fowey Literary Festival, of which she is a trustee.

And in our Community Slot, **Sheila Bawden**, in her role as Chair of the **Lostwithiel Social Club**, gave us an update on the Club as well as delving into the past, telling us how it was formed in 1890 and how it had recently been revived, with events such as the highly successful Mrs Jarley's Waxworks – it's great to know we have such a wonderful, volunteer-run, community asset here in the centre of Lostwithiel! Our Membership Secretary, Stephanie Thomas talked us through the membership renewal process for 2025 (see below) and we were treated (?!) to some Christmas Cracker jokes from our Chair.

#### MARCH OPEN MEETING

Our next Open Meeting is on **Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> March** at 2pm in the Church Rooms, Lostwithiel where we'll be hearing from local historian **Brian Oldham** about **Trades and Occupations in 19<sup>th</sup> Century Liskeard;** the town expanded rapidly during the Caradon copper boom and became an important business centre in east Cornwall. Almost every shopkeeper employed a live-in domestic servant and local investors built new homes from their dividends but many did not survive quite so well. The

talk looks back at life in the bustling market town where the population increased by 50% in just ten years. Brian is President of the Liskeard Old Cornwall Society, is a volunteer at Liskeard and District Museum and has the Bardic name of Istorior Lyskerrys.

#### 2025 MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL

You should by now have received a message from Stephanie Thomas, our Membership Secretary, about renewing your membership which expires on 1st March 2025. ### **Acoustic Guitar for Beginners**

The group is aimed at people who want to start learning to play the guitar. It meets in the Scout Hut in Lostwithiel on the 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month from 10.00am until 12.00pm.

The group has been doing really well and has come a long way since we first started in early 2023. We have learnt several chords now and use them to play along to backing tracks of well-known but simple songs. The group meetings are divided into two parts: the first is an informative session where different guitar playing techniques, chord shapes, strumming patterns and everything guitar is discussed. After a short break for a coffee and a natter we then move Into the second part where we play along to songs using the techniques taught in the first half as well as what we've been practicing at home. The aim is to make this as much fun an experience for everyone as possible and hopefully at the end of each meeting people go away having enjoyed it as well as having learnt something new about this wonderful instrument called the guitar.

David Platt had undertaken some research on Tithes Maps and their use in Family History which he shared with the group. This involved some examples using The Genealogists "Explorer Tool" which enables various maps to be laid on top of each other thus tracing, when each layer is revealed, the evolution of the particular landscape. Perhaps surprising to many of us, The Genealogist has recently beaten both FindMy Past & Ancestry in an independent review carried out by WDYTYA magazine. Our next meeting, on 19th February, sees us taking a look at the use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in Family History. Fascinating stuff!
