Welcome to the June/July edition of the Lostwithiel Area u3a Newsletter. Now "No Mow May" is no more (for this year) we can hopefully look forward to some sunny days and balmy summer evenings! Open Meeting Monday May 20th 2024

At our **Open Meeting** on **Monday 20th May** in the Church Rooms, we were very grateful to Balu Madhvani who stepped in at the last minute when our planned speaker had to postpone due to unforeseen circumstances. Balu treated us to a fascinating talk about his early life in Kenya before moving to the UK in 1964 – and how he came to eventually live in Bodmin. His family had arrived in Kenya in the 1890s from India – along with 30,000 others – to work on the 625 miles long Mombasa (then in British East Africa) to Lake Victoria railway. Over 4,000 died in the making of the railway. We heard about Balu's childhood in Kericho and saw a photo of his birthplace. His mother had been widowed and left with lots of young children. Balu subsequently joined family members in the UK when he was in his early teens and told us of his encounters with racism at school. After working in the family business repairing watches, he went into banking before returning to the jewellery business, running a shop in Bodmin from 1983. Balu also mentioned his long-time involvement with the Bodmin Boxing Club and his role in setting up eye camps in Kenya which have performed 600 cataract operations and helped thousands more with eye problems. And how did Balu end up in Bodmin? Apparently, he ran out of petrol on the A30 and didn't leave! All in all a very enlightening and uplifting talk from Balu and our grateful thanks that he was able to step in at such short notice.

Annual General Meeting Monday May 20th

Our Chair, David Platt, gave an overview of the last year – our 10th Anniversary- highlighting our presence at the Lostwithiel Charity Day, the afternoon tea in February at the Fowey Valley Hotel and the September Cream Tea featuring entertainment by Roger Browne. David also mentioned the new display boards showing group activity, the introduction of Community Slots at Open Meetings and how keen we are to "showcase" individual groups. David noted that Lostwithiel Area u3a currently has 279 members and talked us through the latest accounts as well as offering grateful thanks to Anthony Hindley who is standing down from the Committee as Treasurer. Pickleball - New Group Idea!

Pickleball is a relatively new sport in the UK and is best described as mix of tennis, table tennis and badminton, helping with mobility, fitness and general good health. It can be played by people of all ages and the ball speed is around a third of a tennis ball with underarm serving making it easier to play than tennis, It can be played inside or outside on a badminton sized court. Starting in the US in the 1960s it is now the fastest growing game there with over 4 million players; in the UK there are now over 4,000 players and several u3as have Pickleball Groups.
